# STEP 1 HOSTING & DOMAIN NAME

## Where do I get a domain name and hosting?

many sites that offer domain and hosting service with the appropriate fee, you only need to type in Google and start looking site that offers domain name and hosting that suit your needs.

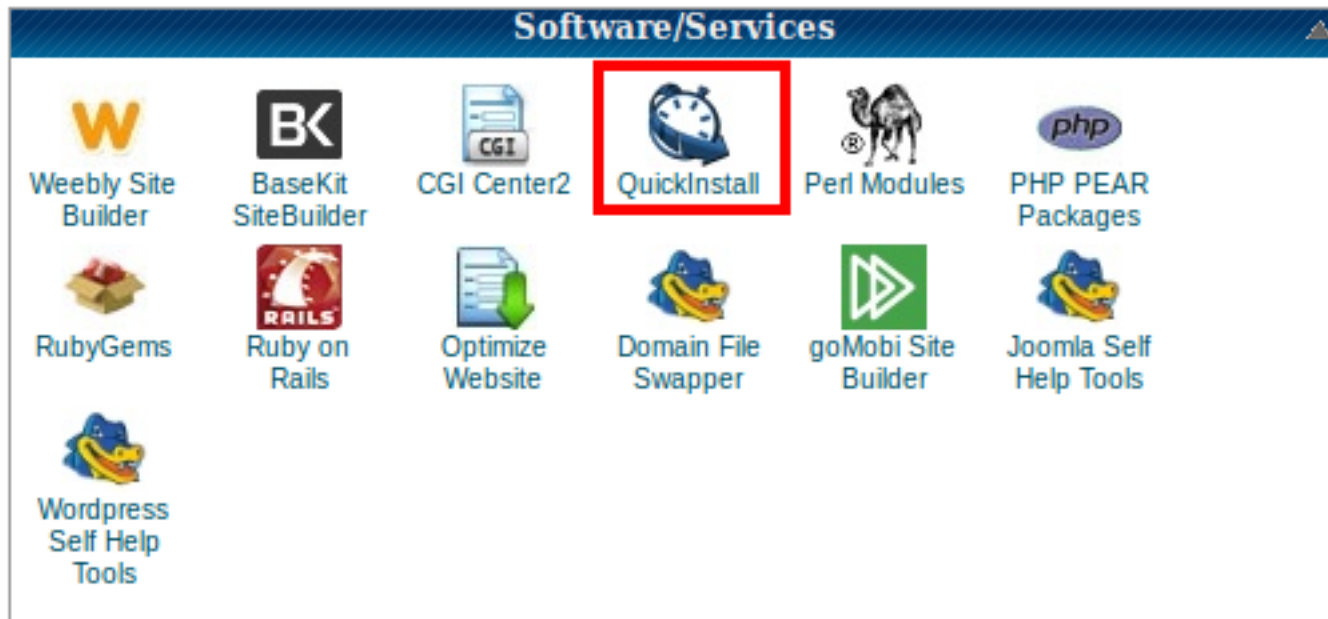

# HOSTING & DOMAIN NAME

- \* To get a new website online, you're going to need two things:
  - A domain name (a web address like yoursitename.com)
  - Hosting (a service that connects your site to the internet)

# STEP 2. INSTALL WORDPRESS

- \* Log into your cPanel.(YOUR HOSTING cPanel)
- \* In the *Software/Services* section, click on the **Quick Install** icon:

- \* In the left menu, under *Popular Installs*, click **WordPress**, then click **Install WordPress**:

# RUN AND INSTALL



Welcome to WordPress. Before getting started, we need some information on the database. You will need to know the following items before proceeding.

1. Database name
2. Database username
3. Database password
4. Database host
5. Table prefix (if you want to run more than one WordPress in a single database)

**If for any reason this automatic file creation doesn't work, don't worry. All this does is fill in the database information to a configuration file. You may also simply open `wp-config-sample.php` in a text editor, fill in your information, and save it as `wp-config.php`.**

In all likelihood, these items were supplied to you by your Web Host. If you do not have this information, then you will need to contact them before you can continue. If you're all ready...

Let's go!

## Run and install

Enter the details for your newly created MySQL database and press the **Submit** button

WordPress will now check if your settings are correct. If you have entered all the necessary information, you will see a confirmation screen. Press the **Run the Install** button to proceed.
