

MAKING THE HANDLE



Step 1a and 1b:
The two longest
lengths of cord are
held together at the
100cm point, then
draped over the
jar allowing 15cm
for the handle. The
longest length is
wrapped around
the jar three times
and back over the
handle. This is
secured temporarily
with an elastic band.

Step 2a and 2b: One 200cm length of cord is folded in half.

The ends are threaded under the cords at the neck of the jar either side of the handle, away from the longer trailing end of cord. These are pulled until a loop appears, then the ends are threaded through and pulled tight to secure.







Step 3: The longest end is threaded under the cords at the neck. It is used to make approximately 14 half hitches, working back across the three handle cords.



Step 4: Step 2 is repeated to secure the opposite end of the handle. At this point, the handle should be secure and can be taken from the jar and placed on the plant pot.

The half hitch is a simple overhand knot, where the working end of a line is brought over and under the standing part. This diagram shows two half hitches.
