

People's use and experience of edges

Edges are of immense importance conceptually and physically in landscape design because they can support diverse human uses and have important experiential and cultural meanings. They are also important because, as spatial components, they are often neglected or ignored

by designers. This neglect may be due in part to binary thinking that categorises mass and space as opposites and negates the possibility of designing 'hybrid' spaces that are neither mass nor space but are both simultaneously.
