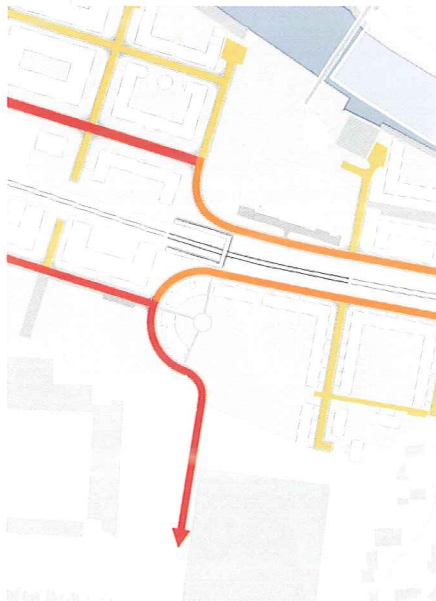


2.10.3 Road/street types

Plans portray the hierarchy of streets within the built form and urban environment. This is presented as a series of lines representing the road/street type and hierarchy, the colours graded in terms of the road/street types.

- Major street
- General street
- Local street

What it shows:

- network of routes
- road/street hierarchy
- grain of network
- relationship to building frontages.

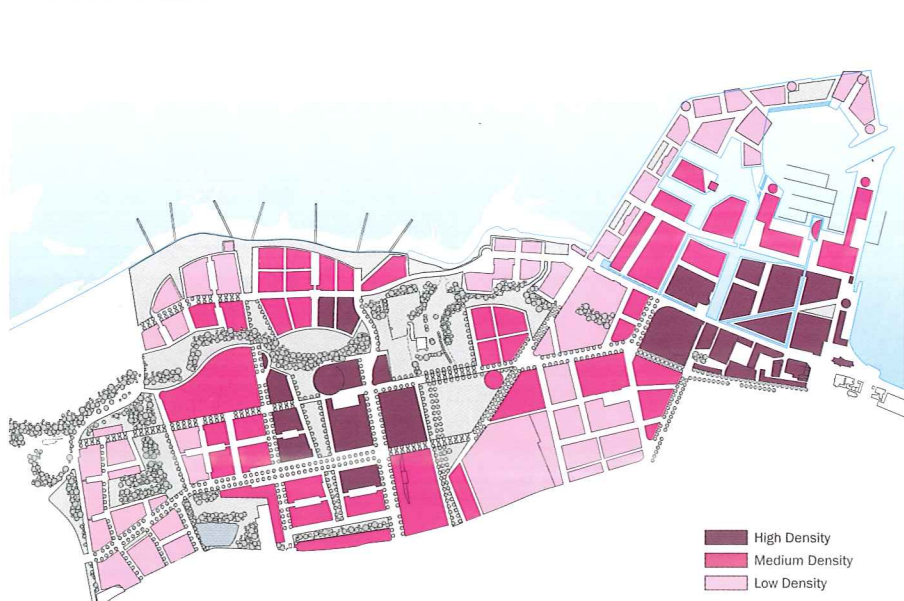
Why it is good graphically:

- clearly shows hierarchy of streets through use of colour
- development detail suppressed to focus attention on road hierarchy.

2.10.4 Density

This plan illustrates an existing or proposed range of residential densities as part of an area study or masterplan. It is generally presented as a graded range of colours or tones on a base-plan to indicate bands of density, with higher densities made the most prominent.

- High Density
- Medium Density
- Low Density

What it shows:

- range of densities
- gradations and points of change
- relationship to open space/ public realm.

Why it is good graphically:

- hierarchy of colour – strongest colour expressing highest density
- all extraneous detail removed
- base-map in neutral colour.
