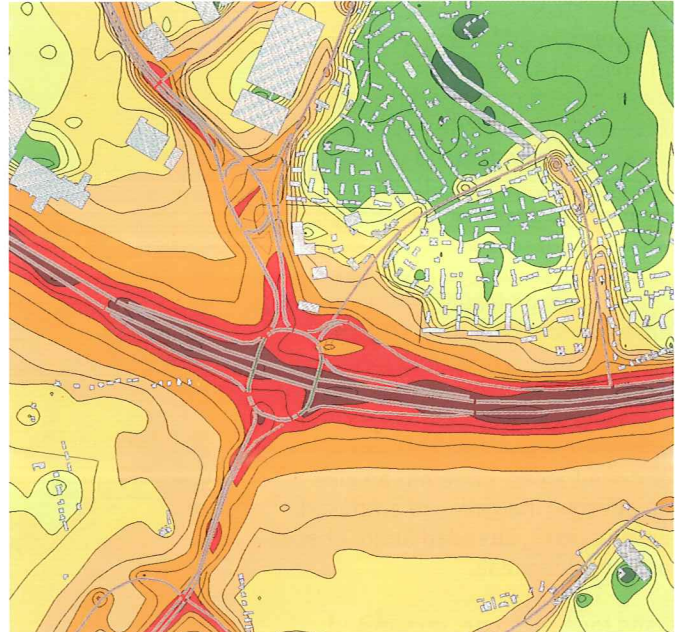
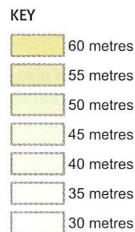


### 3.1.13 Contours

Contours are lines on a map that connect points of the same value. They most often indicate height (altitude), but may also be used to identify other relative values, such as distance in time from a particular point (isochrones) or noise levels from a particular source. They are normally depicted in fine brown or black lines with contour annotation orientated in the direction of the incline. Intervals at which the contours are shown depend on the scale.
