

Permeable enclosing structures

Permeable built boundaries such as fences, trellis and railings enable the visually linking of one space to another. Their use in design is often desirable where physical division of space is desired but complete visual separation is not. Permeable structures play important roles as domestic—public dividers such as street—garden or yard

edges. Permeable structures are often associated with plants as supports for climbers or as forms whose texture or colour is juxtaposed to vegetation. The materials used in permeable structures strongly influence their form, character and pattern.
