ISM-1 2012 in Brief

The Department of Mathematical Sciences played host to the inaugural conference of Institut Statistik Malaysia (ISM) i.e. Malaysia Institute of Statistics, the country's only association of statisticians. The conference is the 1st ISM International Statistical Conference (ISM-1 2012), held at Persada Convention Centre from the 4th to the 6th September 2012. In the

course of these two days, over 130 papers were presented involving more than 160 participants.

The day started with Murphy's Law adage, 'anything that can go wrong will go wrong'. It began with several power sockets found not working and several requested signage boards all wrong and nonexistence. When prodded, the response from the venue's event management was executed but at a gentleman's pace along with a smile that literally said '*Anything for you Doctor*', much to our consternation.

At about 8pm, participants started trickling in. Queues were formed and everybody started to assemble at the ballroom concourse while enjoying their welcoming drink, the Malaysian way-"teh tarik". Whilst waiting, participants browsed through the abstract book included in their conference bag. Excerpts slides of conference schedules, announcements and reminders were put up on the huge screen inside the ballroom similar to a movietrailer in a cinema so that participants could get attuned to the program set out for them. At about 9 am, Dr. Fadhilah Yusof, the Chair of ISM-1 2012, gave a warm welcome to the participants before they dispersed to the parallel sessions. A majority of the participants were statisticians from academic institutions, whereas the rests were practitioners that include researchers from various local government agencies and other bodies such as Department of Statistics Malaysia, Malaysian Cocoa Board, Italian National Statistical Institute and the Indian Statistical Institute. The international participants came from various countries such as Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, Iran, Japan, India, Bangladesh, Australia and Italy.

Each day, three parallel sessions of invited and contributed speakers presented their findings on various topics such as engineering, environment, finance in advanced statistical methods. All in all, as one of the committee member, I would personally say that this conference was a success. Although, there were some grouses for instance on the fees of which some participants thought to be a tad exorbitant, nonetheless, we do receive com-

plimentary comments such as, this is one of the most smooth running conference they have ever attended. Kudos to the committee for managing to keep all the drama under cover. Another factor perhaps is the commitment and cooperation shown by everybody in the team headed by Dr. Fadhilah.
