11. With the image selected, click on the down arrow at Wrap Text and choose More Layout Options.
12. Under Distance from text, type 0.8 in both Right and Left and click [OK].

The space between the image and the text increases.
13. With the image selected, click on the down arrow at Wrap Text and choose In Line with Text.

The image should return to the margin.
14. Try to drag the image to the right.

The image is now anchored in position, and text no longer wraps round it.
15. Click on the Home tab, and in the Paragraph group, click on Center.

Because the image is part of the paragraph, you can use the paragraph settings to position it.
16. Click on Align Text Left in the Paragraph group move the image back to the margin again.

[^0]:    Tip: Most problems with images are with positioning them they do not always stay where you want them! Unless you have a very good reason to wrap text around an image, the In Line with Text setting makes it easier to control where your image is. If you need to place images side-by-side, try using a table and inserting the images into the cells.
